- **Same-Day Assessment:** readily available mental health and substance misuse services for adults and youth.
Hours: Monday-Thursday 8:00 am-3:00 and Friday 8:00 am-12:00 pm at all locations

- **Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP):** a treatment program designed to help individuals with substance misuse or co-occurring disorders manage their recovery and stay on track with sobriety, The program includes 10 groups, along with counseling and case management, providing an average of 10-12 hours of services each week.
